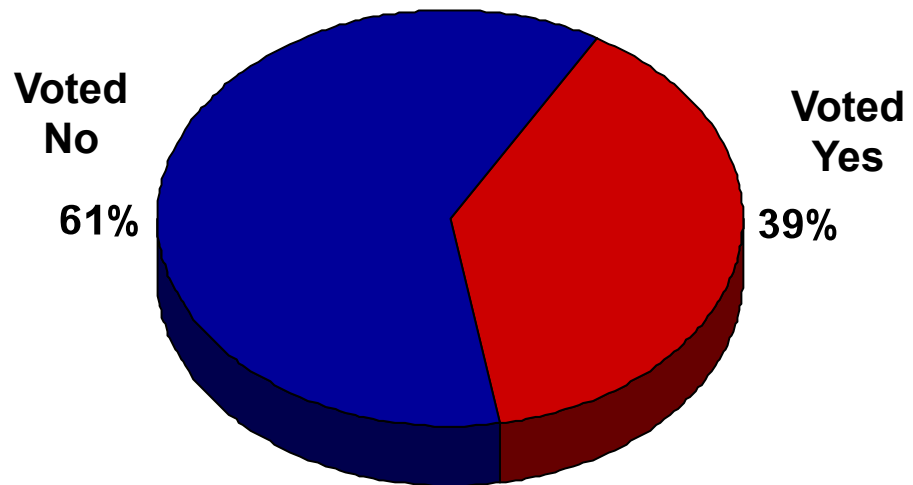
Strong No Vote On Issue 2

How did you vote on Issue 2?

Description of Issue 2 provided:

“One of the measures on the ballot was Issue Two, which would place certain limits on government union contracts and collective bargaining for government employees. A “yes” vote on Issue Two would APPROVE a law placing limits on government union contracts and collective bargaining for government employees. A “no” vote on Issue Two would REJECT the law placing limits on government union contracts and collective bargaining for government employees.

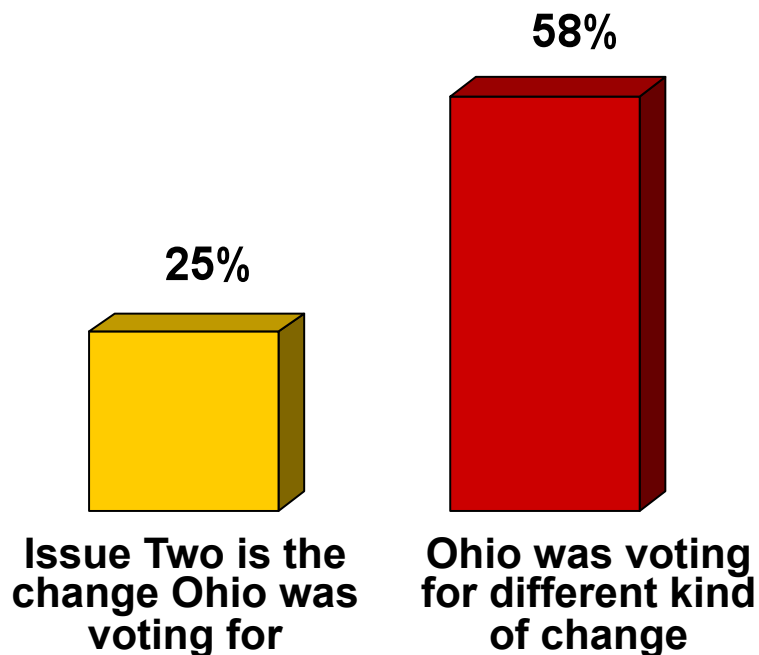

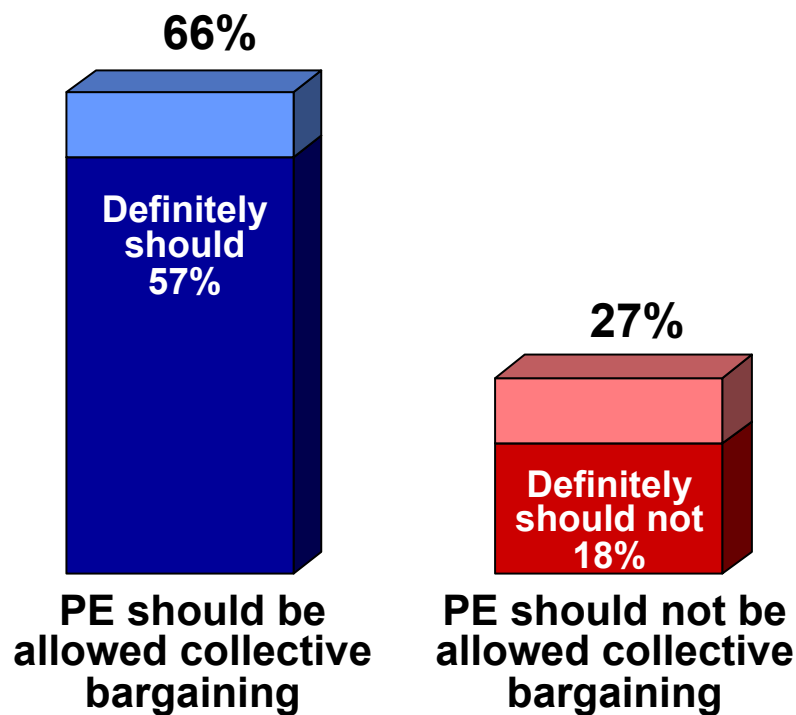

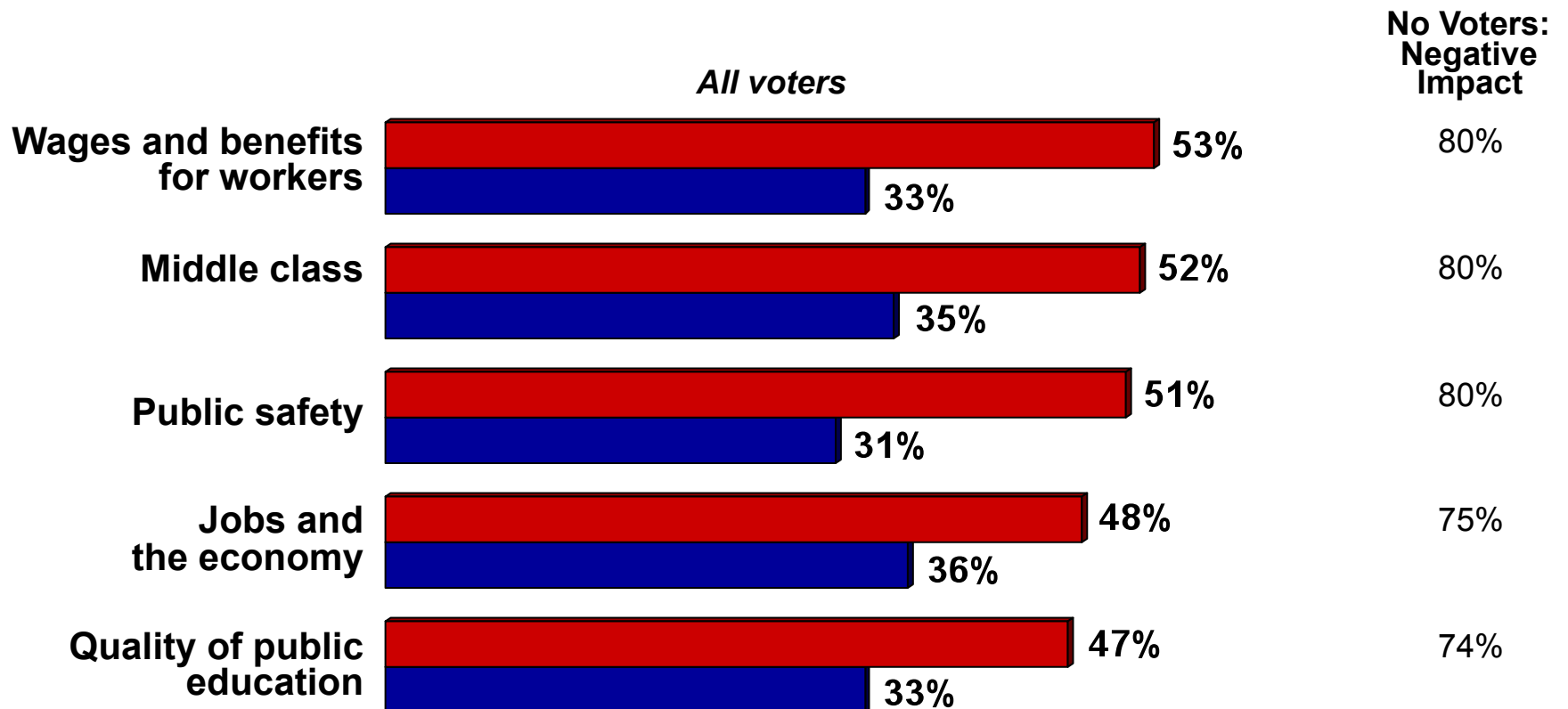

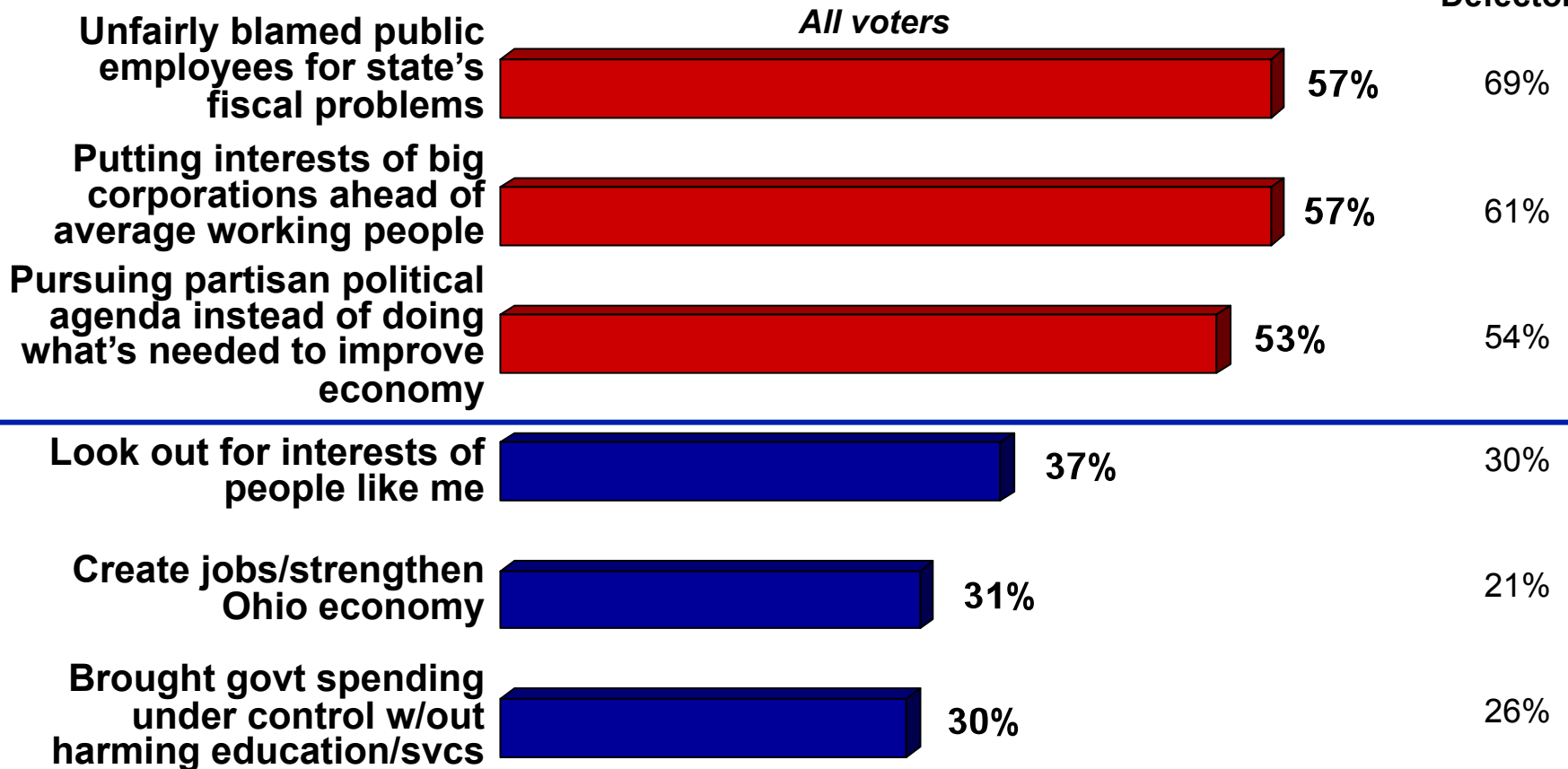

Perceptions Of Governor Kasich And Republicans In Legislature

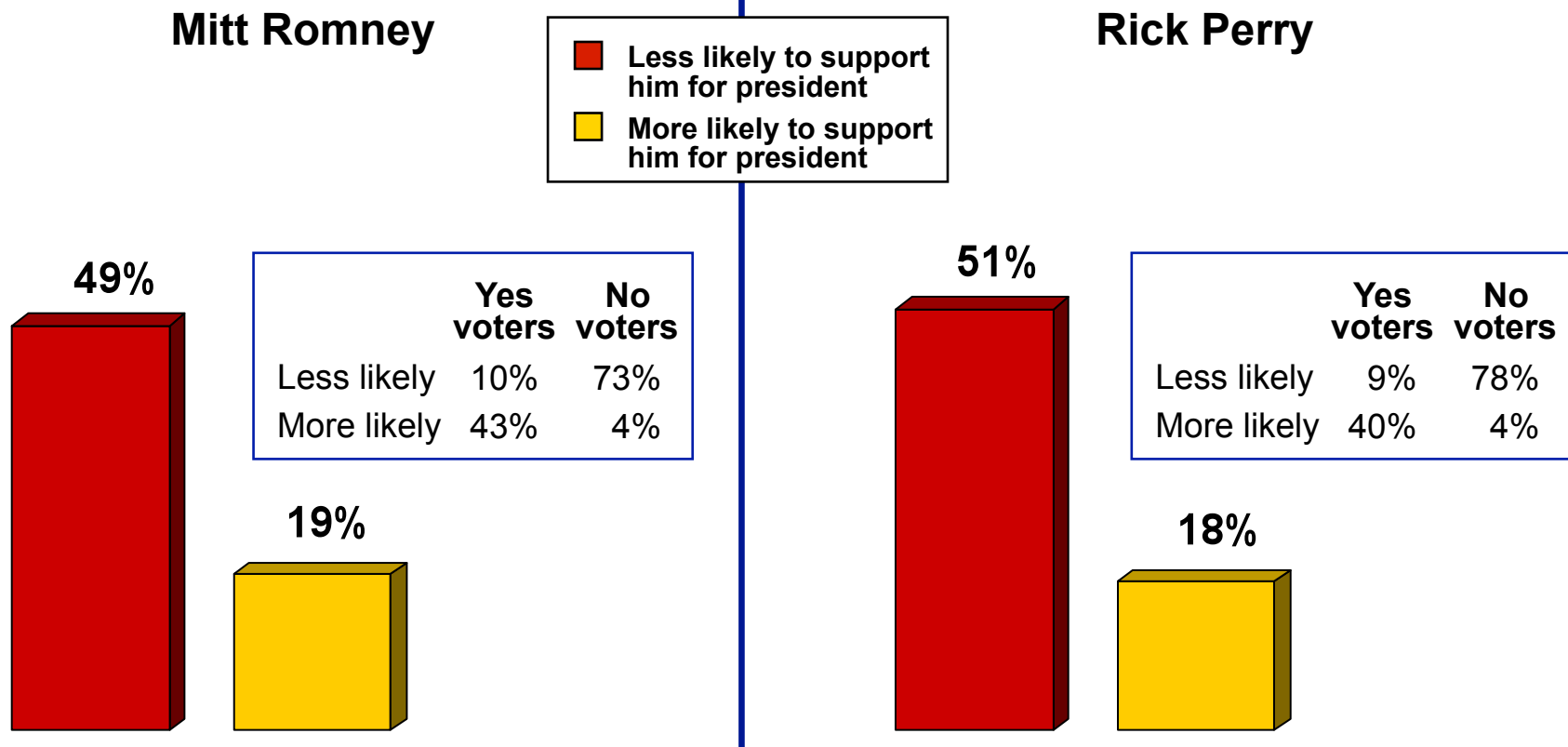

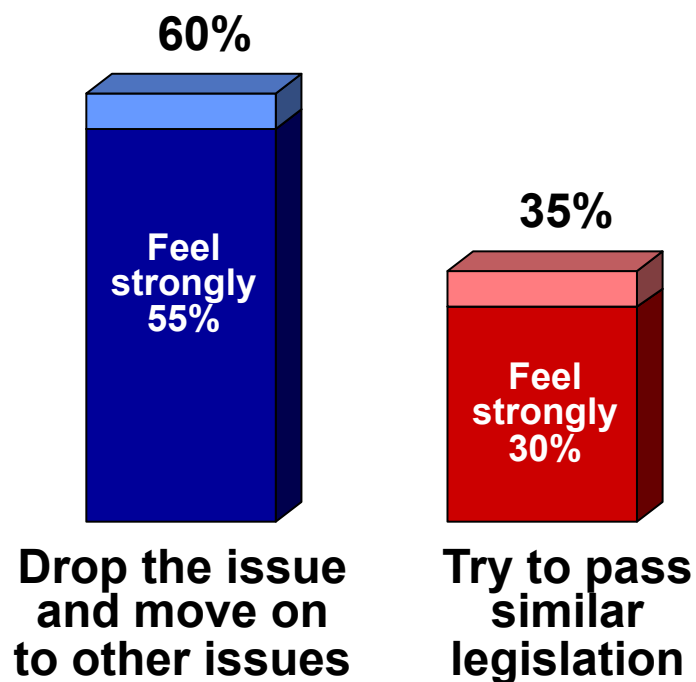
Support For Issue Two Will Hurt GOP Nominee
